Without these clearly defined deliverables, it is difficult for these directions and actions to have much weight or meaning. Clearly defined, measurable actions, to be delivered within set timeframes, will ensure transparency and accountability. This is particularly important for key deliverables such employment and housing growth.	Rewrite actions and directions to be measurable and clearly defined and delivered by a set time. Establish clearly defined targets and deadlines for housing and employment growth.
